Single Digital Gateway Once Only Principle Proof of Concept Pilots Project

- Finnish led project that aims to identify and tackle challenges in the implementation of the EU SDG regulation
 - The Regulation calls for full digitalisation of 21 procedures that are important in cross-border situations and aims to help citizens and businesses in completing those procedures by building a system for providing evidence needed in the procedures.
 - The most volumes in cross-border situations come from neighboring countries -> it is important to find solutions that work between Nordic and Baltic countries





Single Digital Gateway Once Only Principle Proof of Concept Pilots Project

- The goal is to ensure that the final solution for implementation is as costefficient and suitable as possible in the Nordic and Baltic region
- > This will be done by
 - testing with proof of concepts the proposed architecture for the Once Only Technical System (OOTS) mentioned in the regulation.
 - benchmarking legal surveys on SDGR and OOTS done in participating countries
 - collecting lists of evidence to be transferred in the OOTS from each of the participating countries

Achieving the World's Smoothest Cross-Border Mobility and Daily Life Through Digitalisation (CBDS-Data exchange)

- Mobility between the Nordic-Baltic countries is substantial – stimulated by work, studies and family life – but data does not move very smoothly across borders
- Cross-sectoral in nature, coordinated by the Finnish Ministry of Finance, project management from Digital and Population Data Services Agency (FI)
- Project operates from 2021 to 2023
- Linked to the CBDS-Study project



Studying in another Nordic-Baltic country (CBDS-Study)

- Aims to secure fluent study record data exchange between the Nordic and Baltic countries by improving interoperability of existing digital systems and data.
- Digitalisation advances everywhere and citizens interested in studying abroad in the neighboring Nordic or Baltic countries will expect smooth and flexible digital services before, during and after their study abroad period.
- Administrative work related to studying abroad could also be streamlined by using and developing digital services and transfer of study data.
- Project is administered by Finnish National Agency for Education and runs until the end of 2024. In relation to the Finnish Presidency Project this CBDS-Study contributes to work package 1 entitled 'Studying in another Nordic or Baltic country'.





Studying in another Nordic-Baltic country (CBDS-Study)

The project will:

- identify obstacles and create recommendations in the context of student data exchange
- build a Proof of Concept and conduct a pilot solution among selected project partners.
- expand the existing networks, e.g. EMREX

Background

- Established in 2017 at the Digital North conference
- Eight CBDS countries are participating in the project (Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Iceland, Latvia, Lithuania, Norway and Sweden)
- The main goal of the project is to harmonize the national e-ID solutions in the region









Extended Nordic-Baltic cooperation

- Ordinary project activities are going as planned, but the cooperation has been extended to:
- Collaborating on EU-related work, including implementation of the eIDAS-revision, toolbox-work and mutual positioning
- Identifying and sharing best practices on related topics, such as digital representation/power-ofattorneys and digital inclusion
- Piloting the upcoming EU Digital Identity Wallet



- In 2020: 35 000 people moved from one Nordic country to another
- In 2021: 252 000 Nordic citizens resides in a different Nordic country
- 181 000 citizens receive their pension from another Nordic country
- About 9000 Nordic citizens studies in another country from the one they receive scholarships from








Digital Economy and Society Index (DESI) 2022 ranking


